After a three-year COVID-induced pause, the Gimli Rotary Club's Lobsterfest returns to Gimli on July 15 at the Gimli Recreation Centre's curling rink (now, mercifully, air conditioned). Cocktails are at 6 p.m. and dinner will be at 7 p.m.

"We did manage to keep Lobsterfest

alive during those years," said Dave LeBlanc, a Rotary member who has organized this popular fundraising event for many years.

"People ordered lobster from us for pick up and held backyard lobster parties," said LeBlanc.

This year, we can finally tuck in our lobster bibs and get cracking together. And that makes LeBlanc very happy.

"This is one of the few community events where there is dining and dancing. It's a summertime event that brings the community together — including tourists. And it's lobster!" adds Bob Munro, another longtime Rotarian and Lobsterfest organizer: "It's one day of the year when Rotary gets to meet community and community gets to meet Rotary. And you are getting something for your money. We are not just approaching you hat in hand."

Money raised by the event goes to support a myriad of community projects. Over the past three years, the club has planted 120 trees near the athletic fields and other places they were needed.

It also provides fruit and healthy snacks to students in area schools as well as bursaries for high school graduates totalling \$2,500 annually.

The club's Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) sends students to Rotary Camp at Clear Lake to hone their leadership skills.

And the latest project? The club is part of committee raising funds for a youth hub near the Gimli Skate Park. It is intended to be a meeting place for activities and programs and a safe

place to hang out.

Because of Rotary's tireless support for Gimli, businesses are quick to support Lobsterfest in turn by buying tables and donating prizes for silent auctions. This year, the very first auction item the club received was a \$600 tool set from Eddie's Gravel.

High school kids from Interact/ Wave youth clubs are helping with setup and cleanup.

LeBlanc comes by his love of lobsters honestly. His grandpa was a lobster fisherman and lighthouse keeper in the Maritimes.

"I traded lobster sandwiches for meat sandwiches at school because, for me, lobster meat was free. We ate lobster almost every day of the week," said LeBlanc.


His love of community comes naturally as well.

"As an RCMP officer, I belonged in a service club in every community I was posted to. It is fine just to be in the community, but my grandparents taught us to go to things in the community with the intention of helping," said LeBlanc.

fresh in the Maritimes and shipped to Gimli to be steamed to perfection by volunteers.


If you are worried that you don't know the proper way to eat a lobster, LeBlanc promises to give you some

Fair and Rodeo fun





Statement from Finance Minister Cliff Cullen on Tax Freedom Day

Submitted by Manitoba government

For the second consecutive year, the Fraser Institute has named Manitoba the No. 1 province for Tax Freedom Day, the day of the year when the average individual has earned enough money to pay their taxes. For 2023, Manitoba reached that day on June 6, ahead of all other provinces.

Whether it is filling up the gas tank, buying groceries or cooling a home, the purchases Manitobans make daily are becoming more expensive. As Manitobans continue to face a rising cost of living, providing historic help to make life more affordable for Manitobans remains of critical importance to the Manitoba government.

Introduced in Budget 2023, new and enhanced tax measures will bring Manitoba's personal income taxes in line with other provinces. The changes in personal income tax will allow families to keep more of their income and will attract interprovincial migration to grow the economy.

Incremental savings from all tax breaks, school tax rebates and affordability payments from 2022 to 2024 will total more than \$1.8 billion. That is more than \$5,500 for an average two-income family.

A reduction to Manitoba Hydro fees will have a favourable effect on electricity rates and save ratepayers \$190 this year and more than \$4 billion over the next 20 years. Manitoba Hydro's rate application to the Public Utilities Board is now only an increase of two per cent over each of the next two years, compared to the proposed 3.5 per cent rate increase.

Manitobans will see an increase in take-home pay on paycheques due to the largest ever enhancement to the basic personal amount to \$15,000. The savings to Manitoba taxpayers in 2023 will total \$311 million, with tax savings up to \$524 for individuals or up to \$1,048 for a two-income family compared to 2022.

In the last year, Manitoba's economy emerged faster and stronger than anyone could have anticipated. Over the last year, we have seen significant economic growth in our province and an

influx of skilled immigration. We see tremendous opportunities ahead with continued improvement in our fiscal position as we work to create the right conditions for sustained economic growth.














FISHER BRANCH GRADUATION 2023

Oh, the places Fisher Branch Collegiate grads are planning to go!

Fisher Branch Collegiate grads plan to dream big as they step off the Grade 12 stage and head into post-secondary studies and down career paths.

The collegiate and the Lakeshore School Division staff celebrated the success and achievements of 13 graduates during a ceremony held June 24 in the school gym.

Fisher Branch Collegiate vice-principal Donna Gislason, who emceed the celebration, said the grads are a "very high achieving" academic class, with 11 of them entering post-secondary studies this fall and the remaining two to follow in the near future. They plan to become a pharmacist, therapist, social worker, welder, RCMP officer and accountant, among other professions

Collegiate principal Amanda Garton said she taught the graduating students when they were in Grade 7 and again in Grade 12, and this group "has always had a pretty special place in my heart."

When they were in Grade 7, Garton said she had them read the book *Miss Bixby's Last Day*, which features three students who show their favourite teacher — who has cancer and can't finish the school year — how much she means to them by sneaking her out of the hospital for one last visit. Garton herself was going on maternity leave at the end of their Grade 7 year and didn't think she'd be teaching them in Grade 8. She didn't expect there'd be "one last visit" with them.

"They got me to come to the Cougar Den and the whole class shouted, 'Surprise!'" said Garton. "This was no ordinary surprise party and I wasn't prepared for what came next. They ushered me into the room while they played my favourite song on their phones, and all the items laid out at the party were the items Miss Bixby said she would like on her last day. They really had outdone themselves. I don't think I had words; only tears. Not only had they thrown an awesome party, but they connected it to a book. As a teacher, this is what you hope for."





Principal Amanda Garton presented the Governor General's Bronze Medal for academic excellence to Rayna Hawkins.

Lakeshore School Division trustee Shaun Lindal said she's confident the grads are leaving with a solid set of skills and educational proficiency they can draw on as they pursue their life dreams.

"I feel confident that as you move forward away from high school you'll have a large number of skills that will support the choices you've made and your plans and dreams," said Lindal. "I hope that you will find joy and success in whatever you choose to do and will remember all the people in your life who've supported you. After leaving today you'll have many opportunities in your future."

Lindal ended her congratulatory address with an inspiring quote from children's author Dr. Seuss: "Oh, the places you'll go!"

Teacher and guidance counsellor Amanda Bouchard, whom the grads chose as their guest speaker, said she had the pleasure of working with each graduate over the past 12 years, recalling their first day of kindergarten in 2010 when they were "excited, so adorable and nervous."

Bouchard encouraged them to follow their dreams and to remember that dreams don't have deadlines. She dipped into each grad's Grade 1 memory capsule and recounted some of the dreams and aspirations they had back then.





































Lundar students overcame challenges to graduate

Donny Thorkelson, a representative of the Lakeshore School Division, extended congratulations to the gradu-



justices," said Furgala. "What does it mean to cope with adversity? It means that you effectively deal with a very difficult situation; it means you either work through or work around problems in a way that keeps your life in balance. Overcoming adversity is about taking an honest look at your own knowledge and skills, acknowledging your shortcomings and working to improve them every day."

In addition to utilizing their inner strength to deal with adversity, Furgala said resilience includes reaching out to others for support and developing a sense of belonging.

Creating key connections with others — a basic human need — will help the grads live a more fulfilled

life, she said, and that entails faceto-face interactions rather than social media, which studies have shown to be harmful in some ways, including its ability to "disconnect" people from themselves, from others and from nature.

"In today's age we live busy lives, trying to strike a balance between work, school, hobbies, self-care and more. Often, our social connections fall by the wayside," said Furgala. "But connecting with others is more important than you might think. Social connection can lower anxiety and depression, help us regulate our emotions, lead to higher self-esteem and empathy, and actually improve our immune systems. By neglecting our need to connect, we put our health at

She told the grads that they're braver than they believe, smarter than they think and "loved more" than they know, and that they should take pride in how far they've come and have faith in how far they can go.

Evergreen School Division Supt. Scott Hill said the division's overall mission is to help students learn to become contributing citizens of a democratic society, with the freedom to make mistakes and learn from

"Graduates, we've tried to make your school experience one in which you were able to make many mistakes, in a safe place and among people who care about you, and for you to learn from those mistakes," said Hill. "This ability to safely make and learn from mistakes may get a bit trickier as you move into adulthood without a group of people like this group here today surrounding you."

He encouraged the grads to stick with people who care for them and care for others as that'll provide them with a solid support system as they venture out into the world.

"Keep or grow a group of people around you who truly care about you," said Hill. "It's important for you to be part of someone else's group of caring people, too."

Graduate Juel Sigurdson, who earned the Governor General's Academic Medal for having the highest grade point average in Grade 11 and 12 courses, delivered the valedictory address.

She saluted her fellow grads for achieving their diplomas and for the lessons they learned from each other.

"Graduation marks the end of one chapter and the start of the next, that chapter being the rest of our lives. This is incredibly exciting and some of us have it all figured out. But I want you to know if you haven't, that's OK, too. When we do have it all figured out, I know this amazing group of graduates will achieve success in whatever we decide to pursue," said Sigurdson. "I believe this because over the years I have spent with this class, we have become a family of beautiful, caring, extraordinary young adults, and we can do anything we set our minds to."

Sigurdson thanked the grads' family and friends and the community for their support. And she paid tribute to the "incredible staff" at Riverton Collegiate for having their best interests

"We wouldn't be standing here today without all the amazing lessons they have shared with us. We have been lucky enough to be supported and pushed to achieve success in our Manitoba education," said Sigurdson. "We will not only take the educational lessons we have learned, but all of the life lessons we have been taught throughout the years, and we'll cherish those lessons for the rest of our lives."

The Municipality of Bifrost-Riverton, local organizations, businesses, families, academic institutions and Berens River and Poplar River First Nations provided bursaries and scholarships to help the grads pursue future educational goals.

Then, for the first time in three years, the graduates had the chance to enjoy a celebratory dinner at the hall. Families shared the delicious meal together with the graduates,




